Common University Entrance Test CUET (UG) 2022 for

Undergraduate Programmes in Central Universities for the Academic Session 2022-23

Objective:

To provide a single window opportunity to the students to seek admission in different programmes of the participating Central Universities across the country.

Who Can Take Part:

All aspiring students seeking admission in various courses offered at the participating central universities who have either cleared their Plus two level education or are appearing in their final Plus two level education in 2022 are eligible to sit for the CUET 2022.

Executing Agency:

The National Testing Agency (NTA) has been assigned the task of conducting the Central Universities Common Entrance Test.

The Executing Agency Status:

The National Testing Agency (NTA) is an independent, autonomous, and self-sustained testing organization established by the Ministry of Education (MoE), Government of India (GOI) under the Societies Registration Act (1860).

The Basics:

- The University Grants Commission, by its letter dated March 22,informed the Vice-Chancellors of all the Central Universities that the National Testing Agency (NTA) has been assigned the task of conducting the Common University Entrance Test (CUET) for admission in all UG, PG Programmes for the academic session 2022-23 in all UGC funded Central Universities.
- The Central Universities were requested to take appropriate measures to facilitate the process.
- > The Test shall be conducted in 13 languages
- The State/ Private/Deemed to be Universities may also take part in CUET-2022.
- The details of the programmes offered at the various Central Universities are available on their respective websites.

The Basics (contd..)

- ➤ The CUET(UG)-2022 will be conducted in Computer Based Test (CBT) Mode.
- The aspirants, who desire to appear in the test, may refer to the Information Bulleting for admission to Undergraduate programmes of the desired Central Universities (CUs) for admission into the Undergraduate Programmes.
- The aspiring candidates are required to register themselves for undertaking the test.
- The registration process for the Common Universities Entrance Test (CUET) 2022 has begun on April 6, 2022, and is underway at cuet.samarth.ac.in.
- > The registration process will end on May 6, 2022.

Aspiring students are required to apply online and for this they need to Register themselves. To Apply they must go as under:

Steps to followed for submitting the online application:

- 1. Go to the designated site at http://cuet.samarth.ac.in/
- 2. Click on the Register Button.
- 3. Enter the requisite details on the registration form and register.
- 4. Enter your application number and password to sign in if not signed in.
- 5. Complete your application form by filling out the personal details, examination details, and other details as guided by the online platform.
- 6. Upload the requisite documents.
- 7. Pay the fees
- 8. Generate the Confirmation Page

French, Spanish, German, Nepali, Persian, Italian, Arabic, Arabic, Sindhi, Sanskrit, Kashmiri, Kankani, Bodo, Dogri, Maithili, Manipuri, Santhali, Tibetan, Japanese, Russian, Chinese

NB: A candidate can choose a maximum of any 3 languages from Section IA and Section IB taken together

Section II – 27 Domain Specific Subjects:

- Twenty Seven (27) Domains specific subjects being offered under this section.
- A candidate may choose a maximum of Six (6) Domain.

Section III - General Tests

For any such undergraduate programme / programmes that are not mapped but being offered by Universities; a General Test shall be used.

A candidate can choose a maximum of any 3 languages from Section IA and Section IB taken together. However, the third language chosen needs to be in lieu of 6th domain specific Subject chosen by the candidate – as applicable.

The maximum number of tests to be taken remain 9 only i.e., 2 Languages + 6 Domain Specific Subjects + 1 General Test

Or

3 Languages + 5 Domain Specific Subjects + 1 General Test

Important things to Note:

- > The Tests (other than "Language" Test) are offered in 13 languages.
- A candidate is required to opt for **one of the specified languages as the medium of the paper.**
- The question paper in respect of the **Domain Specific Subjects and the General Test**, will be bi-lingual, i.e., it will be in the medium (one of the 13 languages) opted by the candidate and in English. In case of any discrepancy in translation, English version shall prevail except "Language" Tests (Section 1A & 1B).
- Medium is not the same as the "Language" opted as a component of the test.
- The Question Paper of the "Language" Test will not be bi-lingual. Questions in the "Language" Test, are not translation of the questions in English.

Examination will be conducted in two or more slots on different days depending on the subjects/ test taken by the candidates.

- ➤ In Slot 1: which will be held in morning shift a candidate may take up to 4 tests only (One Language from Section IA, maximum of two domain specific Subjects from Section II and One General Test from Section III).
- ➤ In Slot 2: which will be held in the afternoon shift a candidate can take upto 5 tests as follows: One Language from Section IA & IB and maximum of four domain specific Subjects from Section II.

OR

Two Languages from Section IA & IB and maximum of three domain specific Subjects from Section II.

Fee Payment:

After completing Step 1 and Step 2, the candidates have to pay the requisite examination fee. The fee can be submitted only online through Net Banking, Credit Card, Debit Card, UPI, or Paytm Services. Processing charges and GST as applicable are chargeable to the candidate (in addition to the examination fee) by the concerned Bank/Payment Gateway Integrator.
